Social Organizations Throughout Time In The Enfield Sue Thompson, Enfield Town Historian (historian@townofenfield.org)

There have been many social organizations throughout time in Enfield, political, religious and school related. To name a few: The Enfield Valley Grange, Women's Christian Temperance Union (WCTU), Mother's Club, Home Bureau Unit, 4 -H, Boy Scouts, Cub Scouts, Girl Scouts, Baseball Teams, Enfield Falls Home Bureau and Community Association, Others Club (later name Enfield Social Club – 1947), KOTM (Knights of the Maccabees) and Enfield Historical Society.

I recently discovered two Enfield organizations that I had not heard of, "Good Templars" and "Sons of Temperance". Both these organizations operated on a basis of "temperance" as their goal.

The Grand Lodge of the Independent Order of Good Templars (I.O.G.T.) was organized in 1851 in Utica New York by Daniel Cady. Forest City Lodge #3 was instituted at Ithaca and the Templar Grand Lodge of New York was organized at Ithaca in July 1852. Three of the first 6 women who were initiated into the Templars were members of the Forest City Lodge. By 1852 eight lodges were organized in Tompkins County, 20 men and 5 women. By June 1853 there were 93 lodges within New York State.

I did not locate any documents in the Town of Enfield records for either of these organizations. The information is from the Ithaca Daily Journal and various webpages. I am looking for additional information on both of these organizations. In 1875 the Sons of Temperance of Enfield met with members of the Perry City division at their "Hall in Enfield Center". The paper reported the visit was "enlivened by speeches, music and singing". The Hall was either referring to Wortmans Hall (201 Enfield Main Road) or Teeter's Hotel (186 Enfield Main Road).

In August of 1875, the Good Templars of Enfield was officially organized and registered as No. 170 Laughing Water. Tompkins County Grand Templar Lodge met in Slaterville on November 14th and 15th, 1876. A report of this meeting listed members including, Laughing Water, No. 170 Enfield Center – Regular – A.F. Murray, Mrs. Mary Murray, J.P. Topping. Alternates – Miss Mary Murray, Eugene Curry, and M.R. Curry. Discussion during the meeting was, Duty of the Church as relates to Good Templars, How can the County Lodge keep up the interest and promote the interest in the county and subordinate Lodges. What is the duty of Good Templars as relates to Juvenile Templar.

In September 1876 the group met at Garrett's. Garrett's was owned by Captain Henry Garrett, of Krums Corners. It was the Glenwood Falls Property on Cayuga Lake.

In February 1877, the newly installed officers of the Laughing Water Templars were reported as: Worthy (W) Chief Templar(T) M.R. Curry; W. Vice T. Ida Wortman, Secretary A.F. Murry; W. Financial Scribe, B. Oltz; additional members: Mary Murry; Mary Willis; H. Murry, E. Curry, Sarah Willis, Mrs. Mary Murry, Josie Curry, Will T. Graham.

Our Tompkins County Muncipal Historian group met with Ethan Dickerman who is working on the Tompkins County Rural Black Residents Project (TCRBR) https://www.thetcrbrproject.net. The project merges history, genealogy, census records, and maps to spatially contextualize the stories of rural black residents in Tompkins County between 1820 & 1870. He reported there is still lots of research information to add into this project. The History Center of Tompkins County's project called **History Forge**, https://www.historyforge.net/an interactive digital mapping project lead by Bob Kibbee and Eve Snyder, is also involved in the project.

In January our group will be starting a project comparing different years through out Tompkins County towns. The first is December 1941 and January 1942. If you want some good history books about Tompkins County check out the Ithaca History Center https://thehistorycenter.net/, you can order on line. The book Permanent Residents where I tell about John Applegate and Jannette Cone Wickham, is available now. This is a collection of life stories by Tompkins County Historians and edited by Susan Holland.

The Enfield Food Pantry is a ministry of the First Baptist Church of Enfield Center. We are an emergency food source moving from a charity model to one of empowerment and food security.

Our current working facility is inadequate and unsustainable.

We currently function out of the 50-year-old former fire station with very limited parking making the building inaccessible, physically challenging and not inclusive.

There is no room for expansion.

Our vision for our new facility includes:

Being welcoming and accessible:

We operate more like a grocery store model with adequate parking and accessibility and extended hours.

Nutrition Education: Focusing on building healthy bodies.

Food Security: Provision of a gardening space, skills taught from soil preparation to harvest, food storage and preservation.

A kitchen to teach food preparation and provide hot meals with space for meetings and gatherings.

Space to accept donations and distribute clothing, furniture, health products, and other needed household items. Cooler space to preserve produce until distributed.

Our goals include:

Acquiring 5 to 10 acres of land for the facility, parking and community gardens

Build a multi-functional facility 8,000-10,000 square feet.

Provide food, clothing, furniture, hygiene and other needed items. Open extended hours.

You may come to the pantry one time a week, either on Sunday or Monday. If you need food, please know that you will be welcomed at our pantry. We are here to help. Face masks are required. No children please.

The After School Program has openings for the 2021-2022 school year.
